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Strike day—1st March

As you will be aware from the media the National Education Union is planning another teacher's strike day on Wednesday 1st March. This is obviously the week after we return after half term and I wanted to give you as much notice as possible about our plan.

If the government does not engage with the union and the strike goes ahead, all but one of our teachers have informed me that they will be striking on WEDNESDAY 1st March.

As we will have 1 teacher in school on that day we will be able to open for children in years Reception to Year 2 ONLY who meeting the following criteria:

Children whose parents are employed by the NHS, Nursery and teaching staff, Social workers, Police and support staff, fire and rescue, justice system, food – including production and sale, waste disposal workers.

Nursery will be closed.

School will be open 8.40- 3.10.

The kitchen will provide sandwiches, fruit etc. for lunch and entrance and exit will be by the main entrance at the front of the school. Bagels will be provided in the morning in the classroom.

We will have to limit places to 30 in line with DFE guidelines on class sizes. I kindly ask that you do not abuse this offer and only use it if BOTH parents are working that day and CANNOT take time off.

As I have said previously this is not an ideal situation for anyone and our teachers do not wish to strike, they do not get paid whilst striking but they feel that they need to make a stand in securing better pay and funding for schools and I support them in doing that.

The booking system will open on Arbor at 6pm this evening and close on Tuesday 21st February at 9am.

It is worth noting that if you have difficulty using Arbor on a mobile phone switch to using a web browser on a laptop.

I will of course keep you updated of any changes but if the strike goes ahead this will be our plan.
